



Dental Hygiene

This past month was Personal Presentation month at CVO. The first week's focus was on dental care with discussions on types of teeth, parts of teeth, and proper care.

A fun illustration or experiment always makes information easier to understand. One illustration included a visit from "Dr. C" as Michael Brooks demonstrated proper brushing and flossing techniques with the help of a gloved hand and some peanut butter!



All consumers received a toothbrush and floss to take home.



In addition, the consumers conducted the Egg and Coke Experiment. This experiment is meant to demonstrate the harmful effects of sugary, acidic drinks on teeth as the eggshell's calcium is like tooth enamel.

An egg was placed in four different cups, each filled with Coke, toothpaste and vinegar, vinegar, and mouthwash respectively.

The results showed that the vinegar dissolved the egg's hard shell, leaving only the soft, flexible membrane. The toothpaste and vinegar were supposed to show why we brush our teeth, but somehow that part of the experiment failed and the eggshell dissolved, crushing when picked up.

The egg in mouthwash was protected by fluoride and remained hard due to that protection. The Coke stained the egg that was in it.

Currently, the North Carolina State Legislature has not adopted or approved a budget for the upcoming two years.

Rates are 50ϕ per pound for businesses and people under 60 or 25ϕ per pound for seniors and military veterans.
